#### 2022 Bourbon County Brand Coffee Stout, 13.2% ABV, 16.9oz Bottle/\$40

For the first time since 2017, Goose brings back a coffee variant in partnership with Intelligentsia Coffee. Intelligentsia relies on Burundi for some of the cleanest, sweetest coffees in the world; the specific coffee blend combined with BCS is called Turihamwe, which means "together." It's a tribute to all the hands that go into making it – from the female coffee farmers in Burundi that produced the blend, to the crew at Intelligentsia. The result of this "togetherness" is another exceptional coffee variant featuring rich chocolate, coffee, and caramel flavors.

### 2022 Bourbon County Brand Two-Year Barleywine Reserve, 16.9oz Bottle/\$60

Goose Island worked with Old Fitzgerald to obtain three exceptional sets of barrels of varying ages from the distillery's Old Fitzgerald's Bottled-In-Bond Decanter Series. This release offers a rare opportunity to highlight the distinct characteristics of the brewery's rich Barleywine aged in 14-year, 16-year, and 17-year-old barrels of an amazing bourbon pedigree. Bringing back the classic English-style Barleywine for the first time since 2018, Goose knew this was going to be something special. The Two-Year Barleywine Reserve evokes the rich intricacies from that of Old Fitzgerald's Bottled-In-Bond Series for a velvety taste of rich malt, entwined with notes of toffee, cherry, vanilla, fig, and almond.

#### 2021 Bourbon County Brand Fourteen Stout, 13.2% ABV,16.9oz Bottle/\$40

For the first time ever, Goose Island dug into the Proprietor's (Chicago-only release) vault and brought back a fan favorite with Bourbon County Fourteen Stout. But this time, it's with a twist. This version pays homage to the popular Proprietor's 2014 recipe but ups the rye ante by adding rye to the mash bill. Layering cassia bark, cocoa nibs, panela sugar, and coconut water, this stout has an intricate, sweet, and spicy flavor profile.

#### 2021 Bourbon County Double Barrel Toasted Barrel Stout, 16% ABV, 16.9oz Bottle/\$75

This variant was aged for one year in Elijah Craig's Small Batch Bourbon Barrels, then another year in Elijah Craig Toasted Bourbon Barrels. These toasted barrels are built to the same specifications as normal bourbon barrels but are more heavily toasted and very lightly charred.

#### 2020 Proprietor's Bourbon County Stout, 14.2% ABV, 16.9oz Bottle/\$40

Chicago-only release. Each year this release differs from the previous year's brew (Goose Island holds an internal competition among their brewers to decide that year's Proprietor's recipe). Inspired by spumoni; the 2020 Proprietor's is blended with fresh pistachios, cacao nibs, candied Amarena cherries, and natural vanilla flavors.

#### 2020 Anniversary Bourbon County Stout, 15.2% ABV, 16.9oz Bottle/\$60

The Anniversary is aged two years in Weller 12-Year barrels and is a special 2020 variant to celebrate Goose Island's 10-year tradition of releasing Bourbon County Stout on Black Friday.

#### 2020 Bourbon County Special #4 Stout, 13.3% ABV, 16.9oz Bottle/\$40

Oatmeal stout variant, also aged in bourbon barrels, with crystal oats to add a nutty character. After barrel aging, addition of Intelligentsia Coffee, both their cold coffee and single origin coffee beans from Ethiopia, called "Metad Buku." Lastly, bourbon barrel-aged maple syrup from Bissell Maple Farm in Ohio is added which provides complexity to the nutty oats and coffee to round out the flavors.

#### 2020 Birthday Bourbon County Stout, 14.6% ABV, 16.9oz Bottle/\$60

Goose Island partnered with the Old Forester brand and paired BCS with barrels from one of the world's most sought-after bourbons – Old Forester Birthday Bourbon. The limited-edition bourbon, released each year on the founder George Garvin Brown of Brown-Forman's birthday, is made in hand-selected 11-year-old barrels and chosen from one specific day of production – resulting in flavor profiles that vary every year/never replicated.

# Special Guest: 2021 Perennial Artisan Ales Abraxas, 11.5% ABV, 750ml Bottle, \$35

Ale brewed with ancho chili peppers, cacao nibs, cinnamon, and vanilla.
