

# OKTOBERFEST KICK-OFF PARTY BEERS SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 20 (WHILE SUPPLIES LAST)

### Privatbrauerei Ayinger, Aying, Bavaria, Germany, Oktober Fest-Märzen, 5.8% ABV

This award-winning beer is brewed every March especially for the Oktoberfest season. A rich, golden color with a slightly sweet, malty nose. Medium to full body with a soft dryness from maturation. \$12 half liter/\$23 liter

## Hofbräu München, Munich, Germany, Oktoberfestbier, 6.3% ABV

Full-bodied bottom-fermented Lager brewed especially for Oktoberfest since the early 1800s. Light and refreshing with a clean crisp edge and a slight bitterness. \$9 half liter/\$17 liter

### Bayerische Staatsbrauerei Weihenstephan, Freising, Bavaria, Germany, Weihenstephaner Festbier, 5.8% ABV

This brewery claims to be the oldest (still existing) brewery in the world. Founded in 1040, the Bavarian State Brewery Weihenstephan was originally Weihenstephan Abbey, the home of the Benedictine monks until the dissolution of the monastery in 1803. The brewery is perched high above the city of Freising on Weihenstephan Hill. This Festbier is deep gold in color, with a balanced harmony of hop and malt aromas, and full-bodied flavor. \$9 half liter/\$17 liter

### Art History, Artoberfest, Geneva, Illinois, Festbier, 5.8% ABV

Traditional Bavarian-style Festbier with German, Munich, and Vienna malts, and Hallertau Mittelfruh hops. \$9 half liter/\$17 liter

### 3 Floyds Brewing, Munster, Indiana, Munsterfest, Märzen-Style Festbier, 6.2% ABV

A Märzen-Style Festbier brewed with the finest German malted barley, aromatic Bavarian noble hops and traditional lager yeast. This rich malty Lager remains true to the tradition of fest beers originally brewed to honor the marriage of Prince Ludwig in 1810. \$9 half liter/\$17 liter

#### Pipeworks Brewing, Chicago, Illinois, Oktoberfest, 5.3% ABV

This Oktoberfest Lager celebrates a toasty malt sweetness balanced by a spicy hop floral presence. Malt aromas of toasted bread, biscuits, and espresso. Expect a clean and crisp finish. 5.8% ABV. \$9 half liter/\$17 liter

#### Old Irving Brewing, Chicago, Illinois, Oktoberfest, Märzen Lager, 5.5% ABV

Märzen Lager brewed with German malts for a malt-driven body with sweet notes of caramel and toffee balanced by a subtle Hallertau Mittelfrüh hopping for a clean, crisp finish. \$9 half liter/\$17 liter

# Goose Island Brewery, Chicago, Illinois, Oktoberfest, 5.7% ABV

Brimming with notes of toasted malt and freshly baked rye bread. This light-bodied German Lager is clean and crisp with a fine noble hop character and mild earthy bitterness that is the hallmark of Hallertau Hops. \$9 half liter/\$17 liter

### More Brewing, Huntley, Illinois, Oktoberfest Marzen, 5.5% ABV

This amber lager is true to style, with a bold malty backbone and a refreshingly mild hop presence. Toasty bread and caramel notes with firm bitterness for balance. \$9 half liter/\$17 liter

## Maplewood Brewing, Chicago, Illinois, Festbier, 6% ABV

Brewed with the finest German malts and noble hops. Festbier is bold in flavor without being too heavy; expect elegant malt notes with a crisp finish. \$9 half liter/\$17 liter

# Hopewell Brewing, Chicago, Illinois, Märzen-Style Oktoberfest, 5.2% ABV

Rich and malty at the beginning but kept in balance with a hint of noble hop spice and a clean, effortless finish. \$9 half liter/\$17 liter

### Off Color Brewing, Chicago, Illinois, Waddle Märzen, 6% ABV

Warm toasted malts reminiscent of freshly baked bread. Subtle and spicy hop finish highlighting biscuity German malt. \$9 half liter/\$17 liter

### Urban Chestnut Brewing, St. Louis, Missouri, Oachkatzlschwoaf (aka O-Katz) Oktoberfest Lager, 5.4% ABV

This malty yet well balanced Märzen-style Lager is easy to drink, but difficult to pronounce. That is why Oachkatzlschwoaf ("owah-kaatzl-sch-woaff") is also known as O-Katz. Brewed with Perle, Hallertauer and Mittelfrueh hops, and Munich and Pilsner malt. Rich, bready, easy-drinking amber lager. \$9 half liter/\$17 liter
